Life Skills Program

(Bloomingdale, Elgin and Geneva)

Serves students with autism and other disabilities, including those with behavioral and medical needs at our Bloomingdale, Elgin and Geneva campuses.

We focus on students meeting academic and functional goals through increasing communication, providing behavioral and coping strategies.
