Located on a 25-acre camps, this Intermediate
Care Facility (ICF) provides for the specialized
medical, social, emotional and physical needs of the
96 residents and community clients. The campus
includes six 16-bed homes, a specialized accessible
ballfield, and administrative offices, therapy treatment
areas, beauty parlor, dentist office, onsite aquatic
therapy pool and spa, large Multi-Purpose Room,
meeting areas, as well as seven classrooms for the

Community Day Services (CDS) Program.

The Marklund Wasmond Center is a skilled nursing and intermediate care facility for up to 85 children and adults with profound developmental disabilities.
The five-acre campus includes the recently renovated and expanded residential facility and Community Day Services (CDS) center. Services include all fully vent-capable resident rooms, comprehensive respiratory care, dental services, various therapy offerings, social/community activities, as well as Marklund Day School classrooms.



At Marklund, many of our residents are non-ambulatory and have significant cognitive deficits due to genetic disorders, complications during pregnancy and delivery, Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, or drug abuse during pregnancy. Others acquired disabilities during infancy or childhood through tragic accidents. Many have complex medical problems that require 24-hour skilled nursing care and therapy interventions.
